



## ***SCHOLARSHIPS FOR ACCOUNTING STUDENTS***

***The Peninsula Silicon Valley Chapter of the California Society of Certified Public Accountants is accepting applications from students in local colleges or universities for their 2011 scholarship awards. This year the Scholarship Committee expects to make awards in the range of \$250 to \$2,000; awards will be presented at an event on Thursday, October 27.***

### ***Eligibility:***

- Must be a permanent resident or a United States citizen, and either (a) enrolled as a full time student, or (b) working and enrolled as a part-time student.
- Must have declared accounting or business as your major or shown an intent to do so in the future by having taken at least four (4) accounting or business related courses (current enrolled courses will be considered).
- Applicant must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher.

Applicants must submit a completed, signed application form, college transcript, and an essay on a separate, single typewritten page that describes your interest in accounting and your career goals. Consider the following items:

- Do you plan to work in public accounting, private industry or government, or to teach?
- What have you found the most intriguing or interesting about your accounting exposure, either at school or work?
- Do you plan to get your Certified Public Accountant license?
- Are there any unique circumstances you would like the scholarship committee to consider?

Applicants that do not meet these requirements will not be considered. Scholarship awards are not based on financial need. If you are interested in a scholarship, please complete the attached application and return it to the address below. ***To be eligible for consideration, the application and college transcript must be received in CalCPA offices no later than Monday, October 3, 2011. Unofficial transcripts may be submitted to meet the application deadline but should be followed by official transcripts. Evidence of current enrollment must be provided.***
