Application criteria:

1. Must be a permanent resident or a United States citizen, and either enrolled as a full-time student or working and enrolled as a part-time student.
2. Must have completed general college education requirements (usually 2 years) and have declared accounting as his/her major or area of concentration in a business degree.
3. Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher or a 3.25 or higher grade point average in accounting courses. Please submit a copy of your transcript from all colleges/universities attended with your application; unofficial, online printouts are acceptable to document previous college attendance, or to meet the application deadline. An official transcript from your current college must be received within 30 days of the application deadline.
4. Submit at least one letter of recommendation from a dean, instructor or professor detailing your qualifications.
5. Submit an online printout documenting registration for the current semester.

Applicants that do not meet these requirements will not be considered.
