Thank you for your interest in the California Society of CPAs Doctoral Scholarship Program.

Eligibility Requirements

In order to apply for this scholarship you must be:

- Willing to become a CalCPA member.
- A U.S. citizen or a permanent resident of the United States (possess a green card).
- Enrolled in a residential, full-time, AACSB Accredited United States doctoral program in Accounting by September 2010.
- You must also sign an agreement that requires you to teach in a four-year university/college located in the state of California for a period of at least three years.

Terms of the Scholarship

- \$10,000 annual scholarship, eligible for annual renewal – cumulative total scholarship amount not to exceed \$30,000.
- Failure to comply with the three-year California University teaching obligation will require the scholarship funds to convert to a loan (@ 6.8% interest) to be repaid to the California Society of CPAs. The amount to be repaid will be equal to \$10,000 for each year the recipient does not teach in California, up to the total amount received in scholarship funds.

To Apply

The application consists of the following items:

- A completed copy of page 2 of this document – please print legibly or type
- A brief cover letter explaining your reason for pursuing a Ph.D. in accounting
- A copy of your most current resume
- Copies of your undergraduate and graduate (if applicable) transcripts to date
- Proof of your matriculation status (e.g. letter of acceptance)
- A copy of GMAT scores.
- Two letters of recommendation
